PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Jesus said, "As I have loved you, so you must love one another." --John 13:34

Our society and culture tell us what love is and how we should show love in the world. The problem is, that definition does not line up with God's definition of love and how we should show it. Let me give you an example of what I mean.

As I was on my path into ministry, one thing that was required was a psychological examination. I had to go to Chicago for the exam. At the time, I had never been to Chicago. There was a sister institution in the Twin Cities, and I asked to go there, but was told I had to go to Chicago. I was quite worried and concerned about a trip to Chicago.

Paul Doering was a retired United Methodist pastor who was serving the Knapp United Methodist Church. We did not know each other very well at the time. However, he called me up and told me that God had put it in his heart that he should go with me. So, Paul and I went to Chicago the day before the exam, stayed the night, and the next day I completed the exam. We drove home that afternoon, but as we neared Tomah ran into an ice storm. We stayed in Tomah for the night and drove back to Menomonie the next day.

Paul and I became good friends through that experience. It was Paul sharing the love of God with me during that trip that taught me there are different ways of loving others--different from what our society and culture tell us. Love is a bedrock of the Christian faith. It is to live in our hearts and lives, and to be shared with whomever we meet.

We share that love by helping others in need--those with health problems, those in financial problems, those in relationship problems. Basically, those with problems. Jesus specialized in people with problems. With Jesus as our ideal and example, we need to specialize in people with problems.

Go spread the love of God that comes to us through Jesus Christ.






