

## **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Jesus said, "God makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the righteous and on the unrighteous." -- Matthew 5:45

It is a fact that we don't often think about, but the good and the bad live in the same world--this world that God has made. God provides the rain and the sun needed in this world for both the good and the bad. God provides opportunities for both the good and the bad.

In Jesus' time and the Old Testament, the Jewish people believed that they were the chosen race--that God had blessed them above all others. In fact, God had chosen Abraham and his descendants as His people and had blessed them in many ways. However, as I read that scripture, I found no place in which that meant they were better than others. In fact, the Jewish people were conquered many times and taken into bondage many times. Does that mean that those who conquered them were now the blessed of God? No--it means that they were blessed--but they were not THE blessed. I believe the Jewish people were blessed --but not THE blessed.

Through the teachings of Jesus, I believe we are taught to never consider ourselves to be better than anyone else. "The first shall be last, and the last shall be first." Jesus taught a life of service--a life of servant leadership. A servant is never considered better than the master. We are never to consider ourselves better than those we serve.

One of the problems with religion today, as I see it, is that the followers usually consider themselves better than the non-followers. As Christians, we are to present the love of God through word and deed. We are to pray that those we share that love with will come to know God and Jesus in a personal way. Since we never know when that will happen in a person's life, we should never consider ourselves better than that person.

Sunday, May 21 was the last day of SonShine Kids until fall. To celebrate a joyful year of learning, the kids sang several songs during the church service.





Fast forward to 2018, Alyssa and I head to Bloomington, Minnesota to meet Alicia and one of her daughters, Victoria. Through tears all I could say to Alicia was "Thank You."

"What if's" happen in all of our lives. I am thankful that the "what if's" for my family was a gift and the plan God intended. A reminder to never doubt His plan, even in life's difficult times.
