# **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

Jesus said, "I am with you always, to the end of the age." --Matthew 28.20

This is, perhaps, the most important promise from the Bible. Jesus promises to be with us always. He makes this promise to the end of the age.

We need to live God's love in our lives at all times. We need to serve God in the world at all times. We need to keep the love of God through Jesus Christ in our hearts at all times.



## **MEDFORD SALT BOARD**

Elijah, for instance, – bold and cocky, one day, but depressed and suicidal, under a juniper tree the next. Or Jonah, preaching the good news of forgiveness to the Ninevites but then cursing his life under a shrunken gourd plant a short time later. Or David, strumming his harp in praise to God, some days and wallowing in dark, dark depression on other days. Or Jeremiah, wishing he could run from his problems to some little wilderness motel. Or Hosea, feeling betrayed by his beloved Gomer. Or John, the Baptist, wondering from a prison cell, if Christ actually was the promised Messiah. Or Paul, fighting a losing battle with his sinful "self", and doing what he knew was wrong.

We roller coaster riders, you see, come from good stock! When someone tells me that the Christian way is all smiles and goosebumps, I know he is either extremely blessed or extremely ignorant. My experience, at least, testifies to an up-and-down journey that knows both Joy and stillness. And I take heart that so many other people of faith seem to have had a similar ride.

All of this is to remind you that God never promised us a tiptoe through the tulips. Sometimes we'll be down. Some days we may even wonder if God exists. But our relationship to Him, thank goodness, doesn't rest on our fickle feelings; it rests on His faithfulness to us.

What we actually get when we become a Christian is not an exemption from the roller coaster of ordinary human feelings and experiences. That would be nice, but it just isn't so. What we get is a Friend who promises to take all of those harrowing dips and turns with us. We get a Companion who promises to ride with us all the way and to hold us securely in His eternal group. If we soar with eagles, He is there. But if we grovel with grubworms, He is there too.

Well, I got on my theological hobbyhorse, but now I need to get back to my original question: Can I enroll you in the Roller Coaster Club?
