PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Jesus said, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit." -John 15:5

A Christian is expected to bear fruit. It is true that we are saved by faith, but once we have that faith, we are expected to bear fruit. According to this passage of scripture, we are expected to bear much fruit. We are not to come to faith and then sit, reading our Bibles and do nothing else. We are expected to bear fruit.

How do we bear fruit?

Our two churches are bearing fruit. The Medford Church has the "Beds from Christ" program, providing beds for people who are in need of beds. The Rib Lake Church has the Rib Lake Community Food Pantry, providing food for people in need. Both programs have plenty of support from the churches and the communities. Both these churches are bearing much fruit through these programs.

As individuals, we are expected to bear much fruit. We do this by helping people through charities and organizations, and by helping our neighbors with individual tasks, and by supporting charities with our money, by participating in walks and runs and programs designed to support those in need. There are so many ways in the world in which we can bear much fruit. We don't even have to have the burden of organizing these events and programs—they are organized by others in the community or the church. We just have to be a part of the program or event.

This is a debate that has been debated for years. For some, it is enough to come to faith, read your Bible, be in prayer. To them, that is bearing fruit. However, Jesus says that "you will bear **much** fruit." Jesus puts a quantifier on the fruit. Bearing fruit is not enough—it is to be much fruit.

Another way to bear fruit is through the committee work of a church. We are at that time of year where we are filling open positions on the leadership team. Please consider if you are asked.

It is my prayer for you that you, indeed, bear much fruit for God and the Kingdom.




