



# BEDS FROM CHRIST 2023 UPDATE

2023 has been an exciting, as well as challenging, year for the Beds from Christ program. This year has experienced a growth that doubled previous years referrals and bed deliveries. Previously, the program has consistently averaged 29 to 30 delivered beds each year at an expenditure of \$8,000-\$12,000. This year our purchased beds totaled \$22,366. Where did all that money come from? Aspirus Community Benefit Fund provided \$8,000, the sale of the trailer at a financially critical time gave the program \$4,950. When the Lords Acre Sale donated \$3,700 the program was at another financial low. The remainder of the money came from YOU! Your donations, along with other Taylor County individual gifts made it possible to meet every request received. These funds provided every recipient with a new mattress, frame, mattress protector, sheets, pillow(s) and comforter. Additionally, between our congregants and the quilters of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, everyone received additional bedding.

Here's what 2023 looked like for Beds from Christ:

We made a difference in lives of 64 individuals and/or families.

We delivered 56 beds, including cribs in the Medford and Rib Lake area.

We received referrals from: Taylor House, Stepping Stones, Taylor County Human Services, Salvation Army, Medford Area School System, Oasis, and other churches and individuals.

We helped individuals who were sleeping on floors, in lawn chairs, recliners, and bug infested mattresses.

We helped our youngest individual - a newborn; and our oldest - age 77.

We provided beds for a young man ageing out of foster care, a mom and newborn sleeping on the floor, three moms and children leaving domestic situations, a disabled women sleeping in a worn hospital bed, a man who had been living in a camper, a family of 6 that lost their home and car, three families that needed to leave bug infested homes, a blended family with 8 children in need of 7 beds, a young gal just starting out who could not afford a bed but donated \$60.00 to BFC, six non-English speaking individuals, and other persons in economic crisis.

We made a difference because the people of Medford United Methodist church care and support this program. Thank you!

### **MEDFORD FINANCES**

The Finance Team met in October, reviewing finances for the year and trends in donations/expenses. To support the budget for 2023, average giving of \$9,467 per month would be needed. Expenses have increased in some areas (i.e. utilities, insurance) while budget allocations in others have been lower or not expended to help bridge the gap. Overall, our average giving through October has been approximately \$6,400 per month. As you can see, we not able to meet monthly expenses. The shortfall has been met by withdrawing from church savings.

The SALT Board met recently and put together the budget for 2024. That budget would require \$9,646 per month to meet expenses. In the newsletter each month, you see a Finance Report showing the current status of the checking account. In addition, a Monthly Assets report showing savings accounts balances and the mortgage liability, although not printed in the newsletter, is reported to the SALT Board, along with a complete budget page and monthly giving. If you are interested in seeing any of these additional documents or have any questions, please contact anyone on the Finance Team. Your support is vital to the Medford United Methodist Church!
