

World Day of Prayer

Friday, March 1 6:00 p.m.

Community United Church of Medford

Community United Church of Medford will host this year's World Day of Prayer service on Friday, March 1, beginning at 6:00 p.m.

World Day of Prayer is a worldwide ecumenical movement of Christian women of many traditions who come together to observe a common day of prayer each year on the first Friday in March. Each year a different country serves as the writer of the World Day of Prayer worship service. For 2024, the Christian Women of Palestine developed the theme, "I beg you . . . bear with one another in Love," from Ephesians 4: 1-3. A free will offering will go toward the work of World Day of Prayer.

Both men and women are invited to this ecumenical service.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Jesus said, "A new command I give you: Love one another.

As I have loved you, so you must love one another." -- John 13:34

Jesus gives us a command: Love one another.

This is quite possibly the hardest command of Jesus to follow. I believe one reason is that we get the word love confused. We have the modern culture's definition of love, based on the TV shows and movies and books and advertisements. However, that is not the definition of love that God gives us.

For us, the word love is defined by the example of Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ loved the world, and gave us the example of service to the world. Jesus, as King of Israel, came to serve the world. Most kings do not serve their kingdom—they rule their kingdom with an iron fist. Jesus came to serve His kingdom.

The greatest service to His kingdom was dying on the cross for His kingdom. Jesus died on the cross so that our sins could be forgiven and that we may have eternal life. What earthly king would have done such a thing?

His death on the cross was His ultimate show of love, but Jesus loved His kingdom in many other ways. He loved His kingdom through the miracles, healings, teaching, preaching—ways that are too numerous to mention here.

How can this be an example to us?

The love of God can be shown in many, simple ways. We can show the love of God by helping others with their yard word, helping others unload groceries from their car, driving people to and from appointments, helping people clean their houses. We can show the love of God to others by donating to charities, volunteering our time to charitable organizations, and many other ways.

Before I became a pastor, I lived in Menomonie, Wisconsin. I volunteered my time with an organization called "Friends of International Students." At the time, UW-Stout had many international students. We volunteered to sort of adopt and mentor students from other countries to help make the transition to our country easier. That was sharing the love of God with them.

There are many, many ways to share the love of God. It is something that can be done by child and adult. It can be done with family, friends and strangers alike. I urge all of you to share that love of God with whomever you meet.





Call to order-Welcome-Opening Prayer- Co-Chair Bill. Meeting was called to order at 6:30PM. Bill led the opening prayer.

- 2. Steve had devotions but was unable to attend. He sent the message to Bill to read. The theme was what Christmas meant to him.
- Changes to the meeting:

Brenda asked if all the members of SALT Committee were retired? Linda said she still worked till

5pm. Brenda thought if all were retired maybe the winter, the meetings could be changed to the afternoon. The time will stay the same at 6:30 pm.

- Approval of minutes from Nov. 14th SALT Board meeting. Dennis moved; Brenda seconded to approve the minutes. All approved.
- 5. **Review of current finances/vital**: Brenda asked on a \$3,500 Beds for Christ donation. Pastor John said it was a grant from the Methodist Church Conference. Nancy Jones stated that \$470. was earned for Rib Lake Food pantry from the bake sale held on December 17, 2023. Dennis made a motion to approve the financial report., Stan seconded. All approved.
- 6. Pastor's Report:
 - This Wednesday Advent Service will be in Rib Lake.
 - Christmas Eve Day: Rib Lake will have a regular service at 9am, then will have a Christmas Eve Service at 5PM. Medford will have its Christmas Eve Service at 10:30 AM.
 - Pastor John will be on Vacation from Dec. 26 thru Jan 1, 2024. He will be back to work on Jan 2, 2024.
 - Jan. 11, a new Life group will start. It will be "When you Pray". Pastor John will lead the morning class, and Cheryl will lead the 5:30pm class.
 - The North Central conference will not exist in Jun of 2024. This conference will be divided between the Northwest Conference and the Northeast Conference. Pastor John did not know where Medford will be in what Conference
 - General Conference will be held in May and the Annual Conference will be in July.
 - SALT Board Training: Chapters 10 and 11. Next month will be Chapter 12, the final chapter.

Stan said that he would be willing to come and discuss the Financials with the SALT Board. Again, it will be grateful. Thanks Stan and Steve for all your time and efforts with the SALT Board over the years.
