World Day of Prayer is a worldwide ecumenical movement of Christian women of many traditions who come together to observe a common day of prayer each year on the first Friday in March. Each year a different country serves as the writer of the World Day of Prayer worship service. For 2025, the World Day of Prayer Committee of the Cook Islands developed the theme, "I Made You Wonderful," from Psalm 139. A free-will offering will go toward the work of World Day of Prayer.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Jesus said, "Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." -- Matthew 28:20

These words were among the last words that Jesus spoke to His disciples before ascending into heaven. Jesus wanted them to know that wherever they went and whatever they did, He would be with them. He might not be with them physically, but He would be with them through the Holy Spirit. This allowed the disciples to go forth and invite people into a relationship with Jesus. They had the confidence to go forth beyond the boundaries of Israel into new territories and bring Jesus to the world.

Do we believe that Jesus is with us at all times—wherever we are and whatever we do? Think of what we could do if new actually believed that. We would not be afraid to take Jesus with us at all times. We would not be afraid to introduce others to Jesus. We would invite whomever we meet to church with us.

However, we would also know that it is God who brings the people to Christ. We can invite people to church and invite them into the worship experience, but it is God who warms their hearts and brings them to the kingdom. It is God who provides them with their salvation. We are only the vessels through which God works.

James Hays tells a story from his childhood. When he was a teenager, his church was having a revival. His mother invited a family to come and sit in the pew with them. This began that family's regular attendance at the church. They later committed to become Christians and members of the church. One of the children of that family would later become a pastor.

That invitation from James' mother would become a life-changing event for that family. However, once the invitation was made, it was God who did the work on the hearts of that family. It was God who worked on that son and led him into the ministry. James' family was the vessel through which God brought that family to church and then to Jesus.

Too many Christians believe they are the ones who save souls. They put the importance of their ministries on saving souls. Without God, they could do nothing. Without Jesus in their hearts and at their sides, they could do nothing.

As Christians, we are important to God's saving ministry in the world. We are important in helping spread the salvation of God. We are not the ones who save—that is God and God alone. God works through us, and we have to be open to God's work through us. It is God, and God alone, who does the work. We are the vessels through which that work is accomplished.



Keenagers


Friday, March 14th, 7:30 PM Colby High School
